

The winter and spring that we all suffered through seems to have also caused a lot of stress to our hostas.

I found a suspicious hosta, knew its source and checked it out. The original was OK as was another specimen in another garden. I tested it for Hosta Virus X and it was positive! Disposed of properly and then began to watch EVERYTHING. Another funky looking hosta was OK. Then I began to see signs on 'Strip Tease' (susceptible to HVX) which was next to the infected plant and tested positive, even though in the ground five years, - Disposed.

In the meantime I went on the Facebook page *Hosta Diseases and Pests*. From discussions there, plants that have been OK for many, many years are showing positive for HVX as well as other problems as there was also a lot of damage from the sun, cold, etc. including some strange blooms. I recommend you watch your plants, but don't panic. Check carefully before tossing something, and for fun, and info, follow this Facebook page.




